5/3/23 Spoke with Jill.
Received a call from Debbie stating that Arthur is contacting local churches to drop off cards (8) for mother's day and Jane's birthday. The churches are asking to see Jane, at Arthur's request, and Manatawny Manor is refusing access to Jane.

5/8/23 Visited with Jane and picked up the cards. She was well. She talked about Arthur, but said "It's not that I want him here, but I do want to know if he's OK." I reassured her that I was sure that Arthur was fine and that if anything happened to him, she would most definitely be notified. Reminded her of her eye doctor appointment this afternoon and that Jill was going to be accompanying her.

5/10/23 Spoke with Thad regarding the upcoming status conference on Friday.

5/10/23 Spoke with Jill. The eye doctor appointment went fine. She is in excellent ocular health. They ordered new lenses that should be delivered in 3-4 days. Jill did mention that Jane's left ankle was "collapsing" and when they returned to Manatawny Manor, she encouraged her mom to use the walker. When I was with Jane, I did not notice any difficulty with her walking.

5/10/23 Spoke with Dave Jaskowiak.
Spoke with Walter at Eye Consultants and gave a verbal consent for the lens in Jane's glasses to be replaced. He will deliver it to Manatawny Manor and replace it there when it arrives.

5/11/23 Spoke with counsel informing me of the outcome of the status conference this morning.

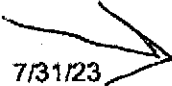
5/12/23 Contacted Brandy to see if she would be willing to supervise Arthur's visits on Mother's Day and Jane's birthday.

5/12/23 Received a call from Brandy stating that she had changed her mind and is not interested in supervising Arthur's visits.

5/14/23 Contacted Abby about serving as a supervisor for Arthur's visits. She agreed to give it a try. Made plans to introduce her to Jane on Thursday.

5/18/23 Received a text from Abby stating that she was declining the opportunity to supervise the Arthur's visits.

Met with Mary Ellen at Manatawny Manor to introduce her to Jane.

Accompanied Jane to lunch at Giovanni's with Jill and Mary Ellen. Had a wonderful time. Jane did very well.

6/22/23 Spoke with counsel updating him on Jane and the Court's barring Arthur's emails.
Spoke with counsel regarding my position on visitation in light of Dr. Ledakis' report.
6/30/23
7/5/23 Phone consult with counsel regarding response to the Court regarding visitation.
Phone consult with counsel regarding response to Arthur's petition.
7/10/23
7/11/23 Signed verification.
Phone call with counsel regarding where we are at with all the petitions that have been filed to be sure that no responses have been overlooked.
7/12/23
7/21/23 Visited with Jane.
Phone call with counsel regarding the Court's orders and their implications.
7/25/23

8/1/23 
Received a call from Manatawny Manor stating that they have 41 cases of Covid. They are all on the 1st floor. There are no cases on Jane's floor, and Jane is doing fine.
Phone call with counsel regarding Arthur's petition.

Received a call from Jen Costello from the Chester County Department of Aging, following up on a complaint made by Arthur. Specifically, she was questioning the reasoning behind Arthur having to pay the supervisor who is supervising his visits with his mother. I explained the timeline of events and informed her that there are court orders documenting all of this. She was unaware of the court orders.
8/8/23
8/8/23 Discussed with counsel the call from the Office of Aging.
Phone call with counsel to update all of the current petitions and orders.
8/9/23

8/18/23	Visited with Jane. Phone call with counsel to discuss the possibility of Arthur visiting on Labor Day It needs to be rescheduled for Wednesday, if he wants to come.
8/22/23	Received a call from counsel to with an update on the zoom conference with the judge.
8/29/23	Visited with Jane.
9/15/23	Phone call with counsel to discuss upcoming review hearing.
9/19/23	Phone call with counsel regarding the upcoming hearing next week.
9/25/23	Phone call with counsel regarding the possible reassignment of Judge Weilheimer.
9/26/23	Attended court hearing on Arthur's petition for unlimited/unsupervised visits with Jane. The judge made no changes to the existing order of visitation at this time.
10/4/23	Visited with Jane. Had a very nice visit. We stayed in the social room. Jane did not want to participate in the activities, but she enjoyed being on the periphery.
10/10/23	Received a call from Debbie stating that Arthur has arrived approximately 45 minutes early for his visit. He would also like to put the ice cream somewhere so that it doesn't melt. Staff will put the ice cream in the freezer. Spoke with Mary Ellen to make sure that she was aware that Arthur was there and waiting to see Jane. Contacted counsel to apirise him of Arthur's early arrival.
11/1/23	Received a call from Debbie stating that Jane has been sent to the hospital following a fall that she had in the hallway. Her vital signs are fine, but she did hit her head and they would like to have her checked out.
11/3/23	Called the ER to check on Jane. She has already been discharged back to Manatawney Manor, as all of the scans are negative for any fractures or injury..
11/3/23	Called Manatawny Manor to check on Jane. She is doing fine.
11/3/23	Contacted counsel to ask him to notify Arthur of his mother's fall, given that she still has some bruising and he will be visiting her this week.
11/13/23	
11/15/23	Contacted counsel regarding Arthur's visit with his mother.
11/20/23	Contacted counsel regarding Arthur's emails.
11/27/23	Contacted counsel regarding my Petition to Withdraw.
11/28/23	Contacted Latisha Schuenemann regarding changes to Petition.

11/30/23 Visited with Jane. Her bruising is almost healed. She went to the hairdresser this morning and was in an exceptionally good mood. Eating lunch when I arrived.

12/6/23 Spoke with counsel regarding updates on the case.

12/11/23 Received a call from Manatawny Center stating that Jane had an unwitnessed fall in her room this evening. She was found sitting on the floor in the bathroom. (She had called for help.) They mentioned that her vital signs were good, but that she was complaining of pain in her left breast. Since she was complaining of pain, I asked that she be sent to the ER for evaluation.

12/11/23 Called Pottstown Hospital to check on Jane. Her CT scan showed a subdural hematoma, so she was going to be transferred to Reading Hospital, since Pottstown does not have a trauma unit, and Reading does.

12/12/23 Contacted Reading Hospital to find out about Jane's condition.

12/12/23 Contacted Manatawny Manor to update them on Jane's condition. At that time, Brenda clarified the pain Jane was experiencing in her left breast. Jane had complained of that pain earlier in the day, prior to the fall. While Jane is in the hospital, I will ask for a doctor to address this issue. I also asked Brenda about the status of Jane's glasses. She is going to look into it.

12/12/23 Informed counsel of Jane's hospitalization.

12/12/23 Visited with Jane in the hospital. She is in the surgical ICU. She is very disoriented and is quite combative with the nurses, which is understandable since she is out of her routine and everything (and everyone) that is familiar to her. Her vital signs were good, and she does not appear to have obvious symptoms due to the hematoma. She is functioning pretty much at baseline, cognitively. She is eating a little bit, but very preoccupied with needing to get back to Manatawny Manor. She is on 1-1 care. The nurse indicated that the hematoma appears stable, meaning that there doesn't appear to be any active bleeding, as the CT scan yesterday and the CT scan today show no change.

Spoke with Dr. Zorn from the surgical team. Dr. Zorn explained that the CT scan showed that this hematoma is an "acute on chronic" bleed, meaning the bleeding was not the result of the fall, and very well could have been the cause of it. As we age, our brains tend to shrink and sometimes the vessels in the membrane surrounding the brain may tear and begin to bleed. Fortunately, the brain's shrinkage provides some room to accommodate the bleeding without putting pressure on the brain, which would manifest itself in some symptomology, such as increased difficulty walking, talking, swallowing, increased weakness on one side, headaches, or a change in cognitive status. She further noted, as evidence of a chronic bleed, Jane shows no signs of trauma - no bruising or lacerations.

12/12/23

Spoke with Dr. Valeri, neurologist. She reiterated everything that had been said by Dr. Zorn. Because of those factors, she is not recommending any intervention at this time. She did state that surgery is not off the table for Jane, even at Jane's advanced age. However, there is significant risk associated with the procedure and right now, Jane is asymptomatic, and the hematoma appears stable. - the risk far outweighs the benefits. She recommends that we keep an eye on the hematoma with a series of follow-up CT scans, the first one in about 2 weeks, and the next one at about 4 weeks after that. If we see that the hematoma is increasing in size, or Jane begins to experience symptoms, then we talk about surgical intervention. She will be moved off of the surgical ICU to the Med Bridge.

12/12/23

12/12/23

Updated counsel on Jane's condition.

Contacted Reading Hospital to check on Jane's adjustment to her new room. She is doing fine, although very "fidgety" and unsettled.

12/12/23

Called Reading Hospital to check on Jane. Everything was status quo - no changes to report.

12/13/23

Mary Ellen went to visit Jane. Jane allowed Mary Ellen to brush her hair, and she ate better with Mary Ellen there.

Mary Ellen also agrees that Jane is very much at her baseline.

12/13/23

Received a call from Irma (social worker). In planning ahead for Jane's discharge, she indicated that the hospital would like her to go the Manatawny Manor's skilled unit for rehab. I expressed that I think that, cognitively, Jane would do much better, and recover faster, in the familiar environment of the Horizons unit. Irma wants to wait until physical therapy has a chance to evaluate her.

12/13/23

Contacted Kay at Manatawny Manor to discuss Jane's return. I explained that the hospital was looking to discharge her to skilled nursing, but that I preferred her going back to the Horizon's unit along with physical therapy, should she need it. She agreed that putting Jane in the skilled section would be just as traumatic for her as the trip to the hospital. She will go evaluate Jane in the morning to see if they can meet her needs on the dementia unit.

12/13/23

12/13/23 Visited with Jane.

12/13/23 Updated counsel on Jane's condition.

12/13/23 Updated Jill on Jane's condition.

Received a call from Irma. She is scheduled to return to Manatawny Manor tomorrow at 9:00 AM. She will return to the Horizons unit.

12/14/23

12/16/23 Spoke with counsel to update him on Jane's condition.

Mary Ellen went to visit Jane. She was in good spirits and let Mary Ellen get her washed and dressed. She ate all of her breakfast.

12/16/23

12/17/23 Spoke with counsel regarding Arthur.

Visited with Jane. She was in very good spirits and very conversational. She recalled nothing about being in the hospital. Took her down to the day room for coffee. She was walking well, using her walker.

12/18/23

12/21/23 Spoke with counsel regarding Arthur's visit.

12/22/23 Spoke with counsel regarding Emergency Hearing.

12/27/23 Mary Ellen accompanied Jane to her visit for the follow-up CT scan. Jane became very disoriented, belligerent and combative almost immediately. There was no way that she was going to sit for the scan. It was decided that we would have to reschedule.

12/27/23 Spoke with counsel regarding Order for Contempt Hearing.

Spoke with Lynn at Tower Health Neurosurgery. We discussed repeating the scan in about 2 weeks, and possibly having medication prescribed that would allow the technicians to perform the scan. We also discussed the possibility of waiting to see if Jane develops any symptoms related to the hematoma, rather than put her through the ordeal of having the scan. Clearly, she is not comfortable being out of her familiar surroundings.

12/29/23 Received a call from Debbie stating that the Chester County Office of Aging was in yesterday regarding a complaint they received regarding Jane.

1/11/24 Spoke with counsel regarding Arthur's response.

1/16/24 Received a call from Willa Greer Westbrook from the Chester County Office of Aging. She was calling in regard to a complaint that was filed in the matter of Jane Herring and wanted to know if I had any concerns about Jane's care. She also asked about Jane's ability to receive mail and phone calls.

1/12/24 Visited with Jane and took her out to lunch at Giovanni's, along with Jill and MaryEllen. We had a very nice time and Jane ate very well.

1/26/24 Spoke with Lynn from Tower Health Neurosurgery. Jane is doing well, continuing to be asymptomatic for any issues involving the subdural hematoma. We will follow up with Tower Health should Jane begin to show symptoms.

2/1/24 Spoke with Thad regarding the upcoming hearing on the 16th.

2/8/24 Attended hearing. Court accepted my resignation.

2/16/24
